Adult exploitation

Exploitation is a form of abuse where someone is forced or coerced into doing things for the benefit of others.

Exploitation is often a gradual process. People are groomed and introduced to new ideas, behaviours and activities. making these appear normal and acceptable. Exploitation is a hidden and complex crime which abuses the basic human rights and dignity of victims who are subject to it. People may not recognise that they are being exploited until their situation becomes very serious.

What does Exploitation Look like?

Exploitation may be taking place even if someone seems to be making their own choices or the activity, they are taking part in appears consensual.

Exploitation can:

• involve force, intimidation, control and coercion –this could be psychological or physical.

 \cdot involve people being forced to take part in the exploitation of others

· be carried out by individuals or groups

Victims

Victims may be subject to one or more of these at the same time –for example being sexually exploited into prostitution alongside organised criminal exploitation.

Trading people as commodities and exploiting them for profit or personal gain has long lasting psychological and physical impact on victims. Victims are often hidden –raising awareness and identification are key to safeguarding.





Ways in which adults can be exploited.

Sexual exploitation - including, but not limited to, profiting monetarily, socially or politically. Labour exploitation – Servitude and forced/compulsory labour are forms of 'modern slavery'. Forced or sham marriageswhere both or one does not consent and or false marriages for immigration purposes Human trafficking - Action or practice of illegally transporting people from one country or area to another, for the purposes of forced labour or commercial sexual exploitation.

Common Features in exploitative situations

Controlling - through violence, humiliation, intimidation. **Depriving** - ability to escape or

Depriving - ability to escape or resist.

Removing - independence, freedom of choice and access to others

Gaining - exploiter gains personally, financially or materially.

Grooming/Befriending establishing emotional connection with victim to lower their inhibitions

Where Can Exploitation Occur

Exploitation can occur in any location, but key potential **settings** have been identified:

- ·Street Homelessness
- ·Business Locations
