

1**What CASPA?**

The Critical Adult Safeguarding Partnership Arrangements (CASPA) seeks to facilitate multiagency interventions for Luton based Adults with complex needs who are assessed as at critical safeguarding risk. CASPA enables safeguarding partner agencies to share information to enhance risk assessment and undertake mitigation and protection planning.

2**Aims and objectives**

CASPA seeks to decrease risk and increase positive outcomes for the Adult with complex needs through:

- Holistic and individualised communication and monitoring arrangements
- Formulation of contingency plans to address possible or known risks
- Identifying and implementing strategies that manage escalating scenarios
- Identify previous and ongoing interventions to reduce service demand and duplication
- Supporting services and/or practitioners to hear the voice of the Adult at Risk
- Evolving Multi-agency Risk Assessment and planning

3**Strategic Priorities**

Comprehensive Assessment:
Coordinated Decision-Making:
Tailored Intervention Plans
Ongoing oversight, monitoring, and review of cases accepted to CASPA jointly constructed and implemented risk management/action plan
Reduction of Harm through early intervention
Maintaining Public Confidence through a coordinated approach

5**Procedure**

The Panel will receive referrals from all agencies:
All appropriate referrals will be screened at the Joint monthly multi-agency CASPA
Partners will gather information on the identified cohort of vulnerable people to provide at the monthly multi-agency CASPA
The coordinator will liaise with all partner agencies regarding ongoing actions and case management .
CASPA may conduct a learning review in the event of Death.

6**Case Responsibility**

The referring agency will continue to act as the lead and present the reason for bringing the case to the panel unless agreed otherwise. The panel does not supersede or take over case responsibility, it remains the responsibility of individual agencies and the referrer to ensure compliance with all relevant legislation and policies. Individual cases discussed will be recorded appropriately and a formal log of accepted and declined cases will be retained by CASPA Coordinator for transparency and auditing purposes.
